A Word from Minnesota Power






Snowmobile Trails Crossing Maps

Firearm Deer Hunting

Firearm deer hunting season begins in November. The Project will reduce activity during the firearm hunting season. If participating this year, before heading out, please review the Project map to better understand if you will be near construction activities.
